Executive Summary:	<p>This report provides further detail to complement the CCG’s newly formatted Integrated Performance Report and reflects the quality priority areas considered and identified through the Quality and Clinical Governance Committee (QCGC) and the Clinical Quality Review Meetings (CQRMs) for all providers of care services in February 2015.</p> <p>Key highlights of the report are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Up to February 2014 the CCG had exceeded its year to date trajectory for Clostridium Difficile infections with 30 actual cases recorded (1 case reported in February 2015), however continued performance has seen the CCG come back into line with the trajectory. The CCG’s Medicines Management team are undertaking root cause analysis reviews in partnership with member practices and are providing training for Primary Care colleagues in clinical practice, and surveillance of antimicrobial prescribing. • The CCG’s acute providers have continued to see increased system pressure and as a consequence both have failed to achieve 4 hour A&E wait targets. Despite this patient experience does not appear to have been adversely affected. • The CCG supported Frimley Park Hospitals Spring to Green week gaining insight into patient journeys at the hospital. <p>This paper links to CCG strategic objectives: <i>Theme-Improved services and care quality for our population Objective 2.
